## Join our FREE Citizenship Preparation Program

### Step 1.

#### Meet the USCIS Eligibility Requirements

- At least 18 years old
- Have been a lawfully admitted permanent resident for the past 5 years without leaving the U.S. for trips of 6 months or longer, and have no special circumstances.  
-Or-  
Are currently married to and living with a U.S. citizen for the past 3 years without leaving the U.S. for trips of 6 months or longer.
- Show that you are a person of good moral character
- Demonstrate an attachment to the principles and ideals of the U.S. Constitution
- Be able to read, write and speak basic English (**Included in our FREE ESL Classes**)
- Have knowledge and understanding of the fundamentals of the history, and of the principles and form of government of the U.S. (civics) (**Included in our FREE ESL Classes**)
- Willing to take an Oath of Allegiance to the U.S.

#### Meet the Montgomery College Requirements

- Maryland or D.C. Resident
- At least 18 years old
- Must be able to attend a minimum of 70% of **all** scheduled classes
- Must be able to attend the scheduled Post-Test class (required even if you have passed the interview/oath)

### Step 2.

Attend one of our 2-hr orientation sessions. (See our website for schedule: [Citizenship Preparation Program at Montgomery College | Montgomery College, Maryland](#))

Requirements at the orientation session:

- A valid Green Card **must** be presented (no copies or photos from your cell phone)
- Fill out our Registration Form and Intake Form
- Watch an informative presentation about our program
- Take the CASAS Listening Placement Test (approx. 45 minutes)

### Step 3. (optional)

Lawyers from *Catholic Charities of Greater Washington* will be scheduled to provide **FREE** pre-screening for new students in order to assess eligibility to apply for Citizenship.

Requirements for pre-screening visit:

- Must attend the scheduled visit date
- Must fill out the online link provided by Catholic Charities for the Consent/Intake Form
- Must be prepared to provide a completed *Travel History* form

### Step 4.

All students are **required** to attend the scheduled CASAS Post-Test class which will take place close to the last week of classes.

Registration and Intake forms for the next session will be handed out and collected for the next session.
