- To earn your TESOL Certificate of Completion, students are required to **successfully complete 4 courses** with a minimum grade of a "B".
 - Each course is 40-hours
 - Classes are held on Saturdays from 9:00a.m. – 2:00p.m.
 - The 8-week schedule alternates between in-person classes and online/asynchronous classes; the first class is in-person.
 - *Each* course requires students to observe an active ESL class, prepare a report on the observation, and a final project.
 - Classes can be taken in any order, but we highly recommend TED001 as your initial course.

Eligibility Requirements

- A minimum of a Bachelor's degree from either a school in the U.S. or country of origin.
- A strong commitment to engage in challenging academic work.
- Willingness to commit to completing four, non-credit, 40-hour courses that require attendance in all classes, effort and participation.
- Commitment to completing each course earning a grade of "B" or higher in order to be awarded with a Certificate of Completion.
- Willingness to independently research a location for the classroom observation requirement in each course.
