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Academic Restructuring

Nearly 200 faculty and staff representatives, chosen by their governance groups and the academic deans, collaborated since September 2013 to restructure Montgomery College's academic units into a model that will enhance collegewide consistency and cooperation, and better support student success. The new structure will include well-aligned disciplines; new managerial functions for the chair role that will ensure strong campus-based decision-making; as well as additional collegewide and national responsibilities for the dean and vice president/provost roles.

The initiative's success is dependent on the active participation of our faculty and staff. The College hosted a one-month review period in February 2014 to allow community members time to review all proposals and materials, to attend information sessions, or to speak one-on-one with your dean, vice president/provost, or directly to the senior vice president during his campus visits. Feedback was also submitted via e-mail. The <u>final report</u> and recommendations were submitted to Dr. DeRionne Pollard, president, on March10, 2014. Dr. Pollard accepted the five recommendations contained in the report on March 31, 2014.

<u>100-Day Report and Preliminary External Evaluation</u>: The College reached its first 100 days under the new academic structure on October 8, 2014. The report was informed by the recommendations of the work groups, which were vetted by the vice president/provosts, the deans, and the College community. The final report is reflective of that vetting process; as such, there are significant differences between work group reports and the final recommendations.
